Schuyler of the Township of Saddle River County and State aforesaid and Gaul Schuyler of the County of Orange and State of New York of the second part Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty Dollars money of the United States to them in hand paid at and before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold remised released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell remise release and confirm unto the said parties of the second part and to their heirs and assigns forever.

The one equal undivided eighth part of the lands formerly in possession of Peter Schuyler late of Bergen County deceased.

Together with all and singular the hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversions and reversionaries

remainder and remainders unto issues and profits thereof and all the whole right title interest claims or demand whatsoever of the said parties of the first part either in law or equity of mind by the same have gained premises with the appurtenances to have and to hold the said land and premises above described to the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns to the only proper use of the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns forever.
