hereby apply for membership in this Society, by right of lineal descent in the following line from

Michael Reasorwho was born in Winchester, Virginia on the 3rd. day of Feb. 1780and died in Little Mount, Kentucky on the 11th. day of June 1843

and who assisted in establishing American Independence.

I was born in Mt. Pleasant County of San PeteState of Utah on the 3rd. day of April 1893(1) I am the son of Samuel H. Allen born 8-15-1882 died 8-30-1928 andhis wife Ida May Lowry born 7-30-1885 died ----- married 6-8-1892(2) grandson of John Lowry, Jr. born 1-31-1824 died 11-7-1915 andhis wife Sarah Jane Brown born 10-27-1834 died 8-25-1920 married 11-27-1851(3) great-grandson of James Brown born 4-22-1803 died 11-3-1871 andhis wife Eunice Reasor born 3-4-1808 died 7-18-1854 married 4-13-1828(4) great-grandson of Frederick Reasor born 1-6-1785 died 1-16-1837 andhis wife Sarah Kester born 7-2-1785 died 1810 married 3-3-1805(5) great-grandson of Michael Reasor born 2-3-1780 died 6-11-1843 andhis wife Anna Herbert born 9-1-1780 died 7-5-1847 married 2-27-1782(6) great-grandson of ----- born ----- died ----- andhis wife ----- born ----- died ----- married -----(7) great-grandson of ----- born ----- died ----- andhis wife ----- born ----- died ----- married -----(8) great-grandson of ----- born ----- died ----- andhis wife ----- born ----- died ----- married -----and he, the said Michael Reasor (No. 5) is the ancestor who assisted inestablishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Fifer in CaptainGilkason's Company of Col. Kennedy's Virginia Regiment under GeneralGeorge Washington. Re-enlisted in Capt. William Frost's VirginiaCompany in April, 1781 and discharged Sept. 1, 1781

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unqualified support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

## ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

SECTION 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the lineal descendant of an ancestor, who was at all times faithful to his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain. — Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 2, 1907, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestors, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 2, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

On May 1, 1777, Michael Reasor enlisted as fifer in Captain Gilkason's

Company of Colonel Kennedy's Virginia Regiment under General George

Washington, and marched through Maryland to Lancaster, Pennsylvania and

later to Philadelphia. In January 1778 he was discharged at Philadelphia.

Then Michael Reasor and his brother Frederick had a ship fitted out and

sailed for Germany and obtained a cargo of one half million dollars

worth of leather goods for the Revolutionary Army. Upon their return

voyage a violent storm arose and disabled their ship. The Reasor bro-

thers and their sailors were rescued by a passing Scotch vessel and the

Reasor brothers were landed in Philadelphia. Their ship and its cargo

were abandoned to the waves of the ocean. Back on American soil and

penniless, Michael Reasor re-enlisted in the Revolutionary War under George

Washington at Winchester, Virginia in 1781, in Captain William Frost's

Virginia Company, and he served with the Revolutionary Army until Sept. 1,

1781, when he was discharged at Richmond, Virginia. He was present when

Cornwallis surrendered his sword to George Washington. For his services

in the Revolutionary Army Michael Reasor was granted a pension of sixty

dollars per year on his application S. 18514, dated Sept. 10, 1832, which be-

came effective as of March 4, 1831. His pension was discontinued on March

4, 1843 for the reason that he had acquired land to such an extent that

under the law a pension could no longer be paid.
