William Hollerton Elder Son & heir at Law of John Hollerton late of East Bradford who died Intestate leaving none to survive him seven children of which William Petitioned this Court this Setting forth in his Petition that the said John Hollerton left none to survive him seven children namely William the petitioner, Liba, James, John, Sidney, Jane married with Caleb Gray the same entomaried with Dell Prichard & that the said Intestate was in his life time and at the time of his Death good & Proper of land in a Manner and Number of Eighty five Acres of Land in the Township of East Bradford, bounded by lands of Thomas Cooper and others which belongs to the said Children according to the Act of General Assembly of the State of New Hampshire or the better setting Intestates Estates meaning that the said The said and One Hundred & Eighty five Acres of Land with the Appurtenances of which the said Intestate died Seized may be divided or Valued according to Law; We the Justices command you that taking with you twelve good & Lawfull Men of your Bailewic, in your proper Person, you go to all & singular the Tenements with the Appurtenances whereof the said Intestate died Seized and there by the Respective Oath & Solemn Affirmation of the twelve good & Lawfull Men of your Bailewic (In the presence of the said twelve good & Lawfull Men of your Bailewic) you cause to be sworn if you will be present) you cause Tenements with the Appurtenances, having due respect to the true Value reported to be divided followeth Vizt Two full & equal Eighth Parts thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for the Intestates Elder Son & heir at Law William, One full & Equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for the Intestates son Liba, One full & equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for the Intestates son James, One full & equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for the Intestates son John, One full & equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for the Intestates Daughter Sidney, One full & equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for Caleb Gray and his Wife Jane in Right of the said Caleb, And one full & equal Eighth part thereof by Meters & Bounds to and for Dell Prichard & his wife Susanna the youngest Daughter of the said Intestate in Right of the said Susanna. But if the said Tenement with the Appurtenances cannot be Divided in Manner and form aforesaid, without prejudice to or spoiling the whole, then We command you that by the Respective Oath and Solemn Affirmation of the said Twelve good & Lawfull Men of your Bailewic, you cause the said Tenement Lands & Premises with the Appurtenances to be Valued & Appraised, And how you shall execute this Writ, you shall make known to our Judges of our Orphans Court for the County aforesaid, forthwith, under your Seal & the Seal of those by whose Oath & Solemn Affirmation you shall make that Indisposition together with this Writ: Witness: Walter Ezeckiel Leonard Esquire High Sheriff of the County of Chester to the Judges in the Writ hereto annexed mentioned, Do humbly make known & Certify, that by Virtue of that Writ on the Second Day of January in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty four I took with me Benjamin Hawley, Richard Jones, Richard Buffington, Joseph Woodward, Abiah Cope, John Patten, Daniel Fitzpatrick, Aaron Clayton, William Rogers, Samuel Stringfellow, Richard Woodward, John Taylor, twelve good & Lawfull Men of my Bailewic, & in my proper Person went to all & singular the Tenements with the Appurtenances in the said Writ named, whereof John Hollerton in the same Writ named who died Intestate, was Seized at the time of his Decease, and there Chaving Warned the Parties to be present according to the command of the said Writ (By the Respective Oath and Solemn Affirmation of the said Twelve good & Lawfull Men, I cannot cause the said Tenements with the Appurtenances to be parted and divided in such Shares & Proportions, & in such Manner & form as by the said to me directed is commanded, without Prejudice to or spoiling the whole; THEREFORE by Virtue of the second command in the said Writ contained I have by the Respective Oath & Solemn Affirmation of the said Twelve good & Lawfull Men of my Bailewic, caused the said Tenements with the Appurtenances to be valued & Appraised as followeth Vizt at the sum of Five hundred and Eighteen Shillings and one Penny half Farthing
