 Society by right of Social descent in the following line from John Young  
 who was born in Hopkinton, Mass on the sixth day of March 1755  
 and died Quincy, Ill on the Swelfth day of October 1850  
 and who united in establishing American Independence.

I was born in Salt Lake City County of SALT LAKE  
 State of Utah on the 8th day of December 1857  
 (1) I am the son of Brigham Young born 1836, died 1908, and  
 his wife Katherine Spencer Young born 1836, died 1885  
 (2) grandson of Brigham Young born 1801, died 1877, and  
 his wife Mary Ann Angel Young born           , died           , married             
 (3) great-grandson of John Young born 1765, died 1839, and  
 his wife Abigail (Nabby) Howe-Young born 1766, died 1814, married 1785  
 (4) great-great-grandson of Joseph Young born 1730, died 1769, and  
 his wife (Mrs) Elizabeth Hayden Treadway born           , died           , married 1769  
 (5) great-great-great-grandson of William Young born 1690, died 1747, and  
 his wife Hannah Healy born           , died           , married             
 (6) great-great-great-great-grandson of            born           , died           , married             
 and he, the said John Young (No. 5) is the ancestor who united in  
 establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of a private soldier, Mass.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE.

"Ancestor. Any one shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of twenty-one years or over, and a citizen of good name in the community, is the Social descendant of an ancestor who was at all times willing in his loyalty to, and rendered active service by, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or volunteer, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by every act of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of National Society, A. S., Article 25, Section 2, adopted June 3, 1867.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.  
 State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you have the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestor, with date of birth and death, if known.  
 By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's service in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution was as follows:

Enlisted for six months service, 5th June, 1780, Major Joseph Housley  
 Brig. Gen. John Glover at Springfield. Age 17 years, Stature 5 ft. 3 in.  
 Complexion light. From town of Hopkinton, Under command of Capt. Dix. Again  
 passed muster Oct. 25th, 1780, under Brig. Gen. Paterson, for six months  
 service (travel 200 miles). Again enlisted in Capt. John Hayward's Co.  
 Col. Webb's regiment, June Aug. 23, 1781 to Dec. 1st, 1781. (200 miles travel home  
 in the Hopkinton town records are the following entries:

"This may certify that John Young, the bearer hereof, late a soldier for  
 six months in the 2nd Mass. Regiment has not drawn any article of clothing  
 out of the public store house during his service. Robert Mussy, Lt. West  
 Point 15 Dec. 1780". Also: "Fishkill, Dec. 2, 1780. John Young, a soldier  
 of Col. Webb's Regiment of Militia, is hereby discharged from the service  
 he having fulfilled his time like a good soldier. Samuel Fay, Com.D.  
 All commissaries are desired to furnish the above named soldier with pro-  
 vision on his way. Samuel Fay, Com.D". It is the family tradition  
 that John's father Joseph was a physician and surgeon in the French and  
 Indian Wars. Joseph's father William was a worshipper in the Old South  
 Church, Boston, where his children were christened by Rev. Peter Thacher.  
 he was one of the founders of Harrington and Nottingham, N.E. but sold  
 all his holdings there in 1724-5.
