APPLICATION of Indigent Soldier or Sailor of the late Confederacy for pension under the Act of May 12, 1899.

To the Honorable County Judge of Burnet County, Texas.

Your petitioner, Isaac S. Chapman respectfully represents that he is a resident citizen of Burnet County, in the State of Texas, and that he makes this application for the purpose of obtaining a pension under the act passed by the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved May 12, A. D. 1899, the same being an act entitled "An act to carry into effect the amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing that aid may be granted to disabled and dependent Confederate soldiers, sailors, and their widows under certain conditions, and to make an appropriation therefor," and I do solemnly swear that the answers I have given to the following questions are true.

NOTE—Applicant must make answer to all of the following questions, and such answers must be written out plainly in ink.

- Q. What is your name? Answer Isaac S. Chapman
- Q. What is your age? Answer sixty two Mar 5<sup>th</sup> 1900.
- Q. In what County do you reside? Answer Burnet
- Q. How long have you resided in said County and what is your post office address? Answer Resided in Burnet Co, 8 years, P.O. Smithwick
- Q. Have you applied for a pension under the Confederate Pension Law heretofore, and been rejected? If so state when and where. Answer No,
- Q. What is your occupation if able to engage in one? Answer Farming when able to do any thing.
- Q. What is your physical condition? Answer I am unable to support myself from piles, weak back and heart disease, & am unable to labor to make support.
- Q. If your physical condition is such that you are unable by your own labor to earn a support, state what caused such disability. Answer piles, old age & ex posure
- Q. State in what company and regiment you enlisted in the Confederate army, and the time of your service? Answer 10<sup>th</sup> Texas Infantry, Co. "I" J.A. Fournwalt was my Captain served from early part of 1862 to close of war after my regiment was captured at battle of Appomattox I was thrown into the 17<sup>th</sup> Cavalry
- Q. If you served in the Confederate navy state when and where, and the time of your service. Answer
- Q. State whether or not you have received any pension or veteran donation land certificate under any previous law, and if you answer in the affirmative state what pension or veteran donation land certificate you have received. Answer I have not
- Q. What real and personal property do you now own, and what is the present value of such property? Give list of such property and value. Answer I own two farms valued at \$4000 & one wagon valued at \$700



Q. What property, and what was the value thereof have you sold or conveyed within two years prior to the date of this application? Answer none

Q. What income, if any, do you receive? Answer none

Q. Are you in indigent circumstances; that is, are you in actual want, and destitute of property and means of subsistence? Answer yes I am

Q. Are you unable by your labor to earn a support? Answer yes

Q. Have you transferred to others any property of value of any kind for the purpose of becoming a beneficiary under this law? Answer no

Q. Did you ever desert the Confederacy? Answer no

Q. Have you been continuously since the first day of January, 1880, a bona fide resident citizen of this State? Answer yes

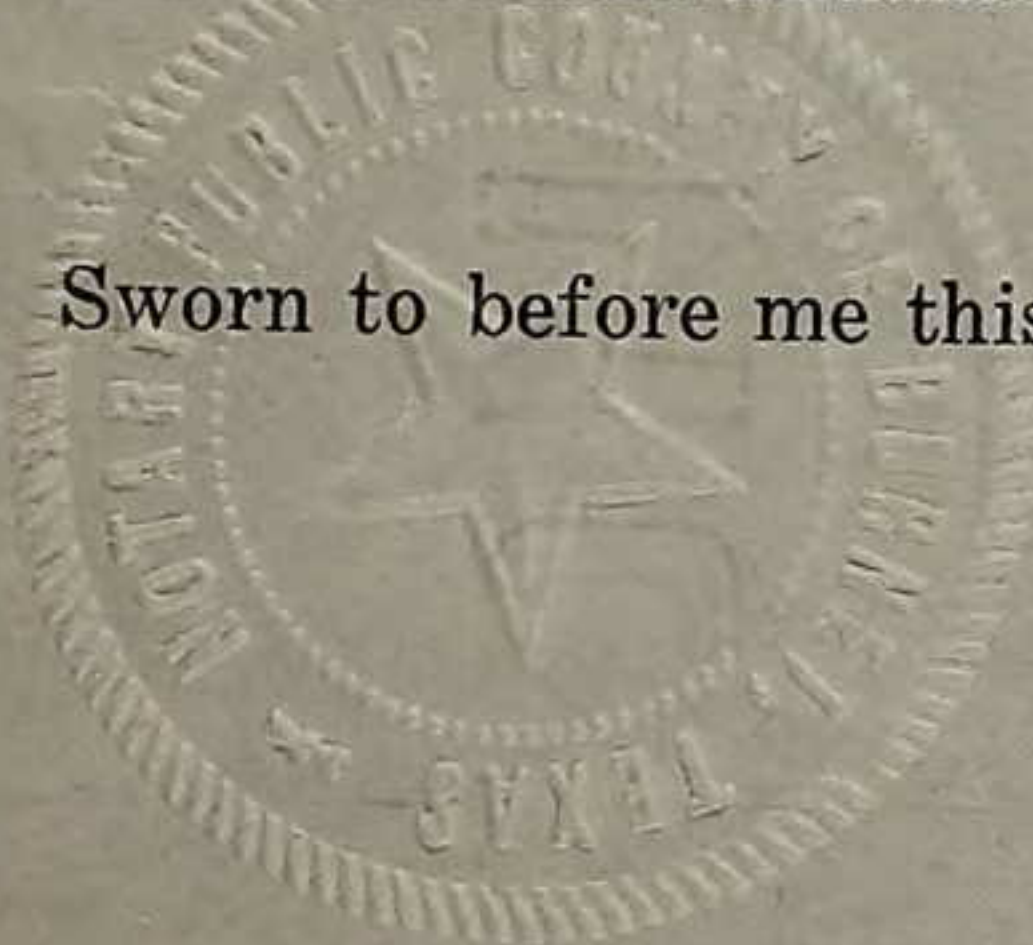
