ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good report in the country, in the lineal descendant of an ancestor who was at all times entitled to his liberty and to the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or as an officer, soldier, seaman, militia, militiaman, or volunteer in the Continental Army, or as a member of the Continental Congress, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence, or as a member of the Continental Congress, or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature, or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by every act of assistance in the victory of Great Britain.—Constitution of National Society, S. A. S., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 3, 1837, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original date; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original. These fully and accurately and traditional ancestry as you found the following record upon, and also the substance of ancestor, with date of birth and death, if known. By order of the Board of Trustees, May 2, 1911, the recipient of a certificate issued on this application agrees to maintain his membership upon failure to pay his membership dues, when his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.
