ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in this Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times residing in his locality, or in military camp, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militia, or minuteman, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or as a member of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety, Committee of Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed some service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article IV, Section 1, adopted June 1, 1897, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original ancestor whom the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one hundred and fifty ancestors, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Applications," should be made in each case and filed with the original.
