



The foregoing is but a small part of the history of our ancestor, John Kilpatrick McDonald. At the reunion we reviewed the goal of a printed family history, with one suggested title of...

JOHN KILPATRICK McDONALD HIS ROOTS AND HIS BRANCHES

It was determined that the history would incorporate information and pictures that can be found on his children and his grandchildren, as well as all possible information about his ancestors. It would interest you to know that at this time there are three living grandchildren of John Kilpatrick McDonald. These are:

Elsie Marie Nott George (she will be 92 on 11/24/84)
Donald Marsden Nott (he is 89 years old)
Agnes Sarah Nott Mansfield (she is 84 years old)

Assuming a 200 page book with pictures and typeset pages with a minimum of 100 to 300 books printed, we estimate a publication cost of \$12.00 to \$18.00 each (based on donated typesetting). A preliminary count showed an interest in 100 books from just those present at the reunion. We probably would print a larger quantity of the pages and bind them in groups as orders are received.

It has been thought wise to set up some kind of a publication trust fund to insure that the project of printing the family history will be completed. In this way orders for books could be placed now and money submitted with complete assurance that if the book was not printed, the money would be returned to the sender. In this way we can get committment of what quantity to print and bind. Craig Carman, the Salt Lake attorney descendant of John Kilpatrick McDonald, will set up the trust. Meanwhile please canvas your family to see how many books would be desired for this "once in our lifetime" offering. Keep in mind yet unborn children who will want their own copy of their ancestor's history and pictures.

Photographs that you think would have general interest for the family should be sent to our Photographic Archivist, Wes McDonald at the address shown for the committee. These photos will then be photographed and returned to you. The best of professional care will be given them.

We are trying to locate a photograph of Rachel Burke Taaffe that can be copied and used in the family history book. If anyone knows of the whereabouts of such a picture please contact Wes McDonald or Dick McDonald. Your interest will be appreciated.

Search through your old trunks, in your attics, in your basements and your garage and see if you can find items or photos that would be excellent for reproduction and inclusion in the family history book.

When our work is finished we will have a hardbound book, approximately 8½" x 11½" with a thickness of ½" to 1" that will add dignity to your library and more importantly a record of your own family with heart warming stories and a family tree. It will be well worth whatever time and money is expended by all.

Please let us hear from you regarding the number of such books that you would want.
