I was born in England, County of Armagh, State of Colorado, on the 5th day of August, 1912.

and be, the son John Young, On 5, I am the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of a soldier, serving under the immediate command of George Washington.

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times including his loyalty to, and rendered active service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or minute man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article IV, Section 1, adopted June 5, 1907, and as amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one Revolutionary ancestor, and it is desired to file additional claims, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Applications," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully such documentary or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestor, with date of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 3, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

A private, Capt. Dick's Company, Massachusetts Militia; Enlisted at 13 years of

Levi Edgar Young (State 377, National 35977).

Young, John, Hopkinton, List of 6 months men raised agreeable to Resolve of June 5, 1780, dated, Springfield. Engaged for the town of Hopkinton; marched to camp July 7, 1780 under command of Captain Dix; his name appears on the pay roll, discharged Dec., 15, 1780; service, 5 mos. 22 days, travel (200 miles) included. He is described as being 17 years of age; stature 5 feet, 3 inches, complexion, light.
