rights and credits of the deceased, which have or shall come to the hands, knowledge or possession of the said  
James Dinkins — — — or into the hands  
or possession of any person or persons for him ; and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited  
into Mukluky County Court, within the time prescribed by law after the date of these presents: And  
the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the deceased, at the time  
of his death, or which at any time hereafter shall come into the hands or possession of the said  
James Dinkins — — — or into the hands  
or possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly administer according to law ; and  
further do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of his said administration, agreeable to law,
