ANCESTOR'S SERVICE.

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of twenty-one years or over, and a citizen of good report in the community, is the direct descendant of an ancestor who was at all times including in his loyalty to, and national service in, the cause of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, seaman, marine, militiaman, or private man, in the armed forces of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or States, or as a signer of the Declaration of Independence; or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Correspondence; or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature; or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain."—Constitution of National Society U. A. R., Article III, Section 1, adopted June 3, 1909.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant desires eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage thereof, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

These fully such documentary or traditional authority as you deem the following record upon, and also the residence of ancestor, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 2, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agrees to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership fee, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

John Young.

Served in Captain Dix's Company of Massachusetts Militia. Enlisted at 18 years and served throughout the war.

Joseph Young was attached to John Cathin's Company of Scouts.

William Young, Brother of John Young is mentioned in the list of men in Colonel Ward's Regiment, enlisted Feb. 8, 1780 for three years
