 all my Shifts, Short Gowns, handkerchiefs, Aprons, and Stockings.
 I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter, Elizabeth Hettelack, the sum of
 Twenty five Pounds, to be put to Interest, until she marry, or arrive to the
 Age of Twenty one Years, the remainder of my loving Offspring and
 of bequest I give to my two Grand Daughters, Elizabeth and Mary, Daugh-
 -ters of my Son Stephen. The Remainder of my Goods and Chattels of what
 kind soever, I give and bequeath to my two Sons, John Hettelack and
 Stephen Hettelack, to be equally divided between them, Share and Share
 alike. I do constitute, make and ordain John Hettelack, Stephen Hettelack
 and George Barnes, my Executors of this my last Will and Testa-
 -ment; and I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and disannul all and
