NOTE: By Constitution Amendment adopted May 22, 1950, Article VI, Section 3, quoted below, was adopted as follows: "No person shall be eligible to citizenship or membership in this Commonwealth, who is under the age of 21 years or over the age of 26 years, or is not a citizen of the Commonwealth." Constitution of Massachusetts, Article VI, Section 3.

Excellent efforts are made to adhere to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unwavering support of the Constitution of the United States of America, so that the inalienable rights of the citizens may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible to membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times residing in the Colony to, and not elsewhere, in the time of American Independence, either as an officer, soldier, sailor, mariner, militiaman, or citizen, who was in the armed forces of the Colony, or of one of the states, during the War of American Independence, or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Contingency, or as a member of any Committee, Board, or Colony Congress or Legislature, or as a recognized person who performed actual service by overt acts of resistance to the authority of Great Britain." Constitution of National Society S. A. R., Article 223, Section 3, adopted June 8, 1957, and as amended.

Membership is based upon your original claim, where the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to take advantage of, however, applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made to each case and filed with the original.

State fully and distinctly or traditional authority as you found the following record upon, and also the evidence of ancestry, with date of birth, death, if known.

By virtue of the Charter of Trustee, May 8, 1851, the original or a certificate granted on this application, shall be considered valid in paying his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

I have heard my father, John Ray Young, say that John Young, when the war began, was living with his uncle, possibly, William, born 1 June, 1763, who was a doctor. They were members of the Minute Men. When the call came they left a yoke of oxen standing in the field where they were plowing, and went on duty. They donated their services.

At a John Young family gathering, 6 Mar. 1942, a daughter of Brigham Young said, "Records show that John Young wintered at Agley Forge, and crossed the Delaware river with Washington and took part in the battles that followed against the British."

"John Young, father of Lorenzo, fought as a youth in the Revolutionary War, company under George Washington. He was raised by his uncle William Young, who was born on 1 June, 1763.
