NOTE: By Amendment to Constitution adopted May 21, 1927, Article 18, Section 3, quoted below, you changed an original age of 21 years of age to eligibility for membership.

Applicant affirms his adherence to the principles set forth in the Declaration of Independence and his unswerving support of the Constitution of the United States of America, to the end that the inalienable rights of the citizen may be preserved and our ideal representative government perpetuated.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICE

"Section 1. Any man shall be eligible for membership in the Society who, being of the age of eighteen years or over, and a citizen of good repute in the community, is the blood descendant of an ancestor who was at all times entitled to the liberty of, and so-called within meaning to, the nation of America Independence, either as a citizen, soldier, seaman, private, settler, settler, or as a member of the Continental Congress, or of any one of the several Colonies or Provinces, or as a member of the Continental Congress or as a member of a Committee of Safety or Comptrolleers or as a member of any Continental, Provincial, or Colonial Congress or Legislature or as a recognized patriot who performed actual service by some act of resistance to the authority of Great Britain." Constitution of National Society, A. S. Article 18, Section 3, adopted June 2, 1907, and so amended.

Membership is based upon one original claim; when the applicant derives eligibility by descent from more than one ancestor, and it is desired to make adequate record, separate applications, to be marked "Supplemental Application," should be made in each case and filed with the original.

State fully each Ancestry or Traditional Authority as you found the following record upon, and also the evidence of ancestry, with dates of birth and death, if known.

By order of the Board of Trustees, May 2, 1911, the recipient of a certificate granted on this application agreed to surrender his certificate upon failure to pay his membership dues, unless his membership shall cease by reason of death or actual disability, to be determined by the Society of which he is a member.

My ancestor's service is attesting to the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution was as follows:

I have heard my father, John Ray Young, say that John Young, when the war began, was living with his uncle, possibly, William, born June 1, 1763, who was a doctor. They were members of the Minute men. When the call came they left a yoke of oxen standing in the field where they were plowing, and went on duty. They donated their services.

At a John Young family gathering, 6 Mar. 1942, a daughter of Brigham Young said "Records show that John Young wintered at Agley Forge, and crossed the Palmyra river with Washington and took part in the battle that followed against the British.

"John Young, father of Lorenzo, fought as a youth in the Revolutionary War, company under George Washington. John Young's father dies in 1766, and the boy John Young

was raised by his uncle William Young, who was born on 1 June, 1753.
