next ensuing; and the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said Deceased at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said *Mary Woolleton and Wm Woolleton* or unto the hands and possession of any other person or persons for *them* do well and truly administer according to law.
