

I Carl S. Collett born of goodly
Parents Salvemus Collett &
Ethelwynne Strongham June 10th
1922. I was the youngest of two
family. The oldest of the first
family was Wyley, then Owen
one girl Alice then Byron. My
Mother's family was Howard
Edna, Edith and Carl the last
We lived in Maeser at
2763 No - 1500 W. when I have
now built a new home. I was
a spoilt child and I did throw
tantrums at the breakfast table
that was the only spanking I
ever received from my father.
He took me in the bedroom
and spanked me with his shoe.
My father was bishop at the Maeser
Ward for about 5 years and I
was teased as being the bishops
Boy which I didn't like

My father died in April 1932. I was 9 at the time. I was too young to go to the funeral. My mother had a hard time raising me so my brother tried to discipline me but I could climb higher into a tree so I most generally escaped. Acel hall and I burned our hay stake down at the age of 4. We haled water for the canal $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away with a wooden barrel on a sledge pulled by one horse. Mother + Aunt May had a maytag washer also on a sledge to wash with back and forth. I rood hay horse for the hasking at the age of 10 for 50¢ a day. I trapped muskrats in the winter and sold the hides of Montgomery for 50¢ to \$1.00.

I worked for Bill Mott in
a service station at 5th west
and main. I liked to mechanics
and Boy in High School. Two
I went to provo in High School
for two years and at Vermont and
I graduated from there.

My mother's family was Howard

one lived in Provo at
1500 W. when I was
born. I had a new home. I was

ever received from my father.
